
AUGUST 23, 2020 TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

When I was a child it seemed the annual question asked each Fall as school started was. "What did you do this

summer?" This summer's answer would be unique in some ways but also similar in other ways. In the youth ministry office at St. Benedict we actually had quite a few new experiences. For the first time we offered a service week for high school students. Our group spent 5 days serving at Our Lady of the Angels Mission in Humboldt park. Each day we helped in a variety of ways. The ministry to the community that the Mission provides is so important. It was a blessing to be able to serve and work

there. Monday and Tuesday we helped with the packaging and distributing of food in the neighborhood. Because the community is already situated in a food desert and with the pandemic complicating the ability for people to get fresh food, the food distribution is extremely important to the community. We also helped sort through donations of school supplies so the sisters at the Mission could provide these needed supplies to the children. I hope our relationship with Our Lady of the Angels Mission continues to grow in the coming years. We look forward to working with the Franciscans (Sisters) of the Eucharist again, in December and we are already planning to go back

for a week in the Summer of 2021.

Youth Ministry also offered, for the first time, the ALPHA series using Zoom as the setting. Every day we shared the videos and conversations about faith ignited by the series. Even though Alpha for Youth is normally offered in a face to face setting, the group that participated in this series was able to still have thought provoking dialogue with the material and with each other. There was a time when I would have imagined social media and access to the internet would be a deterrent to parish ministry. This summer I found that the internet and Zoom were a saving grace.

For the last two summers we have been able to offer Vacation Bible School to our St. Ben's families. This year we were able to offer it also but, with a little twist. In collaboration with several parishes in our Vicariate we planned and offered VBS on Zoom. With a combination of live sessions and pre-recorded sessions we gathered twice a day with our friends. There were daily songs, we learned about saints, spent time learning about our Blessed Mother and read and shared bible stories. 103 children were able to participate in Vacation Bible School this summer. We especially learned to "Trust in Jesus!"

With the awareness of discrimination and inequality in our world and in our city, I was approached by a high school student wanting to help build a more inclusive community at St. Benedict Parish. This desire contributed to the formation of a group that has been focusing on how to promote inclusivity. From one person's desire to raise awareness and create change we have been moving toward action. Soon the group will be taking over the @stbencym account on Instagram. STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In last week's Gospel, we heard the story of the Canaanite woman (a Gentile) who appealed to Jesus for help, and her prayer and plea were answered. Part of the message of that is that the Kingdom of God is open to and offered to all peoples.

This week we hear Jesus say to St. Peter in the Gospel from Matthew, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." An important part of the Vatican flag is two keys. Those keys, of course, represent the keys to the kingdom to which Jesus makes reference. Were you aware that one key is gold and the other silver. Interpretation is that the gold key represents spiritual power and the silver key represents worldly power.

We are also fond of images and more showing Saint Peter at the gates

of Heaven deciding who is admitted and who is not. Nevertheless, the keys are reinforced in the Acts of the Apostles, and it is perhaps not that Peter opens the gates of Heaven, but Peter (and Paul as well) through his ministry and explanations make it clear that heaven (the kingdom) is available to all, Jews and Gentiles.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1023) states, "Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are perfectly purified live forever with Christ. They are like God forever, for they 'see him as he is,' face to face." Pope Francis has spoken on this more than once. Recently, he stated, "The Lord has redeemed all of us, all of us with the Blood of Christ. However, we must meet one another doing good." Our call is clear.
